Scholarships may be awarded to high school seniors or post-secondary students who meet the following criteria:

Eligibility Criteria--To be eligible, the applicant must:

1. Be a resident of Lyme/Old Lyme.
2. Be accepted at and planning to attend a technical school, post-secondary training program, community college, or an accredited college or university, in the fall.
3. Be committed to various forms of community service, and have a record of public service to the community, as documented in this application, and/or your resume.
4. Financial need in your ability to pursue a post-secondary education.
5. Graduate students are NOT eligible for our Lions Club Scholarship.

Application Process:

1. **For high school seniors:** Either obtain an application from the Guidance Office or go to the Lyme-Old Lyme Lions Club Website, www.lymeoldlymelions.org, Scholarship Tab, and download/print a copy of the application, complete it in full, add all required attachments [e.g., Recommendations, references, resume, transcripts, essay] and send it to the Lions Club address indicated.
2. **For community college, college, university, and technical/vocational school applicants:** Go to the Lyme/Old Lyme Lions Club Website, www.lymeoldlymelions.org, Scholarship Tab, and download/print a copy of the application, complete it in full, add all required attachments [e.g., Recommendations, references, resume, transcripts, work experience, essay] and send it to the Lions Club address indicated.
Alternatively, your institution of higher learning may wish to directly supply or help you supply the Lions Club with the required information.
3. Application should be returned to the Lyme-Old Lyme Lions Club Scholarship Committee, PO Box 32, Old Lyme, CT 06371 and postmarked **NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, MAY 15, 2025.**
4. Complete the application in full, to include the following:
 - a. Write an essay about yourself.
 - b. In your resume, or in writing if not included in your resume, describe how you have participated in community service activities while in school or out of school.
 - c. Provide the Scholarship Committee with a high school, community college, technical/vocational school, college, or university official transcript.
 - d. Include two letters of reference, one being from an individual who has known you as a student or an employee (teacher, coach, counselor, supervisor), and one from a person who has observed or known of your community service work. The reference must not be a relative.
5. You may be asked to participate in an interview with the Lions Club Scholarship Committee as part of this process.
6. The recipient(s) will be notified by mail, and will be invited to attend a Lyme/Old Lyme Lions Club meeting where the scholarship(s) will be awarded, in June / July 2025.
